#### **BRUSH PICK-UP FOR MAY**

The next seasonal City brush pick-up for this year will be in May. Summerlakes falls within Zones 1 & 2.

Zone 1 (north of Batavia Road) - first Monday of May

Zone 2 (south of Batavia Road) - second Monday of May

Please keep in mind that brush is required to be out by 7:00 a.m. on the designated Monday, but pick-up may occur on a day later in that week.

Brush piles must comply with the following guidelines:

- One pile per address
- Pile cannot be greater than 3 feet in height, 8 feet in depth, and 15 feet in length
- Branches cannot be longer that 8 feet in length and no more than 8 inches in diameter
- Branches must be placed with the larger cut end toward the street

Brush pick-up is limited to trimmings (not tree removal) from bushes or shrubs, and branches from trimming and/or pruning trees. Other items such as logs, root balls, stumps, lumber, etc. will NOT be picked up. Brush piles that do not conform to these standards will NOT be picked up and a notice will be left on the front door. #### Hi Neighbor!

I wanted to let you know what happened to us last summer. We had these plants in our yard and weeded them out. We think they came from bird droppings. We had an itch rash all up and down our arms from removing them. We did some research on the plant and found it is called Pokeweed. It was new to our yard. We saw it growing in several other yards and taking over.

We encourage you to do your own research on credible websites as many of you have young children and pets who might touch and/or eat the berries. I am not an expert in any way but wanted to share our experience.

**From Mountsinnai.org:** Pokeweed is a flowering plant. Pokeweed poisoning occurs when someone eats pieces of this plant. This article is for information only. DO NOT use it to treat or manage an actual poison exposure. If you or someone you are with has an exposure, call the local emergency number (such as 911), or the local poison control center can be reached directly by calling the national toll-free Poison Help hotline (1-800-222-1222) from anywhere in the United States. The highest amounts of poison are found in the roots, leaves, and stems. Small amounts are in the fruit. Cooked berries and leaves (cooked twice in separate water) can technically be eaten. However, this is not recommended because there is no guarantee that they are safe. The roots should never be eaten. Symptoms most often appear within 6 hours of ingestion. Symptoms: convulsions, diarrhea, head-ache, unresponsiveness, nausea, stomach pain.

**From WebMd:** Pokeweed is LIKELY UNSAFE. All parts of the pokeweed plant, especially the root, are poisonous. Severe poisoning has been reported from drinking tea brewed from pokeweed root and pokeweed leaves. Poisoning also has resulted from drinking pokeberry wine and eating pokeberry pancakes. Eating just 10 berries can be toxic to an adult. Green berries seem to be more poisonous than mature, red berries. When applied to the skin: Pokeweed is LIKELY UNSAFE. Don't touch pokeweed with your bare hands. Chemicals in the plant can pass through the skin and affect the blood. If you must handle pokeweed, use protective gloves.

Doing these things early will eliminate the rush and hold-ups at the front desk when the pool season begins. Entrance to the Clubhouse will not be allowed if accounts are not

current and if residents don't have their ID's on hand. There will be NO EXCEP-TIONS! Students graduating from the fifth grade and turning 11 years old before September 1st are eligible to get their Clubhouse ID's (with parental approval).
